

Hello families,

Welcome back, we want to share important news about breakfast and lunch. Recent federal and state decisions now allow the District to temporarily serve free meals to all children until December 31, 2020. This decision is subject to change at the federal government's discretion. The District still requires that households' complete applications for free and reduced meals as usual and return them as soon as possible in order to maintain eligibility after December. Meals will be provided at no cost. They will be distributed in school for in-person students. The District will also provide meals for remote students and hybrid day students. We will be distributing meals to parents on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays for students learning fully remote at home and students learning through the hybrid model. Fully remote students will receive 2 meals on Monday and 3 meals on Wednesday. Hybrid students will receive 1 meal on Monday or Tuesday and two meals on Wednesday. Pick up locations will be at the Sousa Elementary parking lot and Schreiber High School student entrance from 9:30 am to 11:00 am on the days mentioned.
